

GROUND CONTROL TO PILOTS: All clear for Red Bull Paper Wings 2015 takeoff!

MAC Gym at the Kansas State University Recreation Center at 4 PM on Monday, March 9th, 2015

76 universities and over 2,000 students competitors across the USA are preparing for Red Bull Paper Wings, the world's premiere paper airplane competition. Red Bull Paper Wings is a simple, yet ingenious concept: make a plain sheet of paper fly as far, as long or as artistically through the air as possible. 2012 proved to be one of the most active international competitions between 83 participating countries and 37,000 students, all meeting for the world championships at Hangar 7 for a showdown of the world's best paper airplane pilots.

Knowledge, creativity, and nimble fingers will guide the construction of your paper aircraft, and each will be put to the test on college campuses across the country, as pilots will be judged in three unique categories:

Longest distance: how far the paper plane travels through the air

Longest airtime: how long the paper plane remains in the air

Aerobatics: creativeness and artistic presentation the plane and thrower

12 national finalists will earn a spot in the Global Finals at Hanger-7 in Salzburg, Austria on May 8-9, 2015.

Please attach an essay of 500 words or less about your service to the university community including the importance of leadership, citizenship and moral integrity.

The Chester E. Peters Student Development Award

This scholarship is awarded to a student that will be of junior standing as of Fall 2014, who has contributed in an especially positive way to the development of other students. Please attach an essay of 500 words or less about your outstanding qualities of leadership, citizenship, moral integrity, service and how your university experiences have encouraged, supported and participated in the development of fellow students.

Roy C. Langford Memorial Scholarship



SECURITY AND BUILDING ACCESS

As we prepare for Spring Break 2015, it is important for each of us to remember that while we all share good will towards everyone in our APDesign Community we must

remain vigilant about protecting ourselves, and each other against damage and theft.

Even with the security systems and video monitoring we must all do our part like making sure doors are locked, reporting suspicious activity, taking home computers or locking up computers when away for long periods of time is a simple but effective way of keeping possessions safe.

Some of the recent security enhancements include a large number of security cameras that are live 24 hours a day to record any activity in our entrances, exits and corridors. Key card locks have also been added to many of the lab doors. Again, this is to protect the college and keep out unauthorized users.

We all sincerely hope that you have a wonderful and restful spring break and come back better than ever!

Please remember that technology and restricted access alone are not enough to avoid all criminal activity. In this case please lock all doors, secure all equipment and belongings, remove doorstops, lock windows, avoid working or walking alone and be sure to report any suspicious activity immediately.

BUILDING ACCESS

If you wish to enter Seaton Hall and Seaton Court after normal business hours or on the weekend, there are certain doors that remain unlocked for 24-hour access. Seaton Hall can be accessed on the south side of the building through the main doors across from the K-State Union both upstairs and downstairs. Seaton Court can be accessed by the east and west doors from the courtyard area into the building and through 106D Seaton Court, for access to the LASER Club space.

Please do not disturb other faculty, staff or students by attempting to get them to open the doors for you to gain access when doors are locked.

The K-State Police can be reached by calling (785) 532-6412 on in an emergency; do not hesitate to call 911.

IN ADDITION!

Please be sure to back-up your data to an external hard drive and do not leave this with your primary computer. Some data can be stored through your account on our servers. (We are working to increase this capacity).

The work all of you are doing here is significant and important. We raise this issue of safety not to cause fear, but to avoid the feeling of violation and loss of security that comes with thievery.

Third Floor Tidbits

Cha-ching!

As a patron of Weigel Library you are responsible for the materials you borrow. It is important you pay attention to loan periods, due dates, and fee/fine charges for those materials.

Weigel Library staff provides a date due slip for each type of material borrowed as well as verbally communicates the due dates. The cold, hard fact is you are ultimately accountable for the materials you borrow and the fines you might incur!

Fine Charges -

2-hour Reserves - \$2 per hour, with a \$36 maximum
All other Reserves - \$5 per day, with a \$35 maximum
Recall materials - \$5 per day, with a \$15 maximum
3 and 7 day loans (bound periodicals and media) - \$1 per day, with a \$7 maximum

The fine and fee charges are determined by K-State Libraries, and Weigel Library has to collect them! You may pay by cash or check in Weigel Library, by credit or debit card in Hale Library, or online through your *My Library Account*.

Avoid overdue fines - save the library staff additional paperwork (thanks) and buy yourself an extra coffee!
