Parking Citations Appeals Board. Although the Judicial Branch is looking for highly motivated/accomplished students, no previous experience is required to apply. SGA's Judicial Branch is a great opportunity to gain leadership experience in an organization dedicated to enhancing students' collegiate experience. More information about each position is listed below.

Student Review Board is composed of one faculty member and five students. It is responsible for the primary hearing of complaints that happen on campus, in the residence halls, or at university-sponsored events. This board works with students to 1.) determine whether a student was/was not in violation of KSU's Student Conduct Code 2.) provide educational sanctions for students found in violation to promote growth as an individual as well as a member of the K-State community. They also hear what are referred to as 20g hearings, which involve student's failure to comply with or complete the educational sanctioning they were issued.

Student Tribunal is composed of one faculty member and five student members. Its duties include but are not limited to interpreting the SGA Constitution, By-Laws and legislation upon written request by the Student Body President, Chair of Student Senate, or by presentation of a petition signed by 50 members of KSU SGA, trying bills of impeachment, hearing appeals from all boards except Parking Citation Appeals Board, hearing cases involving special circumstances or situations for which jurisdiction is not otherwise outlined, and hear appeals from committees created by Student Senate.

Parking Citation Appeals Board is composed of six students, three faculty and two members of the classified staff. This board considers student, faculty, and staff appeals of Kansas State University Parking Services parking citations.

JANI TO PRESENT TEDx TALK

Vibhavari Jani, Associate Professor in the Interior Architecture and Product Design Department for the College of Architecture, Planning and Design has been selected to give a TEDx talk titled "Rethinking Rehabilitation, Health and Healing Environments for Wounded Warriors." TEDx talk is being hosted at Independence Community College in Independence, KS. Vibha's TEDx talk will be telecasted on April 29th, 2016.

Through an innovative partnership with Soldiers Agricultural Vocational Education (SAVE) to assist the wounded soldiers, SAVE is a non-profit organization started by retired Major Gary LaGrange. SAVE's mission is to provide agricultural vocational education and healing resources to our returning wounded warriors. Jani worked with her graduate students to test a new healthcare concept developed by Major LaGrange, that combines Farm Training and Healing center for the soldiers. Vibha's TEDx Talk features this new concept.

[A TEDx event](#) is a local gathering where live TED-like talks and videos previously recorded at TED conferences are shared with the community. TEDx events are fully planned and coordinated independently, on a community-by-community basis.

Manhattan, Salina, and K-State's Global Campus students may apply.
