











# Jarvis Fellowship, Graduate Research in Landscape Architecture

#### **Award**

Two qualified applicants will receive a one-year (12-month) graduate research fellowship, which includes **an annual stipend and full tuition support** for enrollment in the Kansas State University post-baccalaureate MLA program. Fellowships may be extended for a second year, pending performance review.

#### **Fellowship Description**

Central to our landscape architecture program's mission is a commitment to integrate student learning and faculty research. In collaboration with Associate Professor Jessica Canfield, Mary K. Jarvis Chair 2018-20, the Jarvis Fellows will engage in a shared learning experience to develop original research related to **materials and performance in landscape architecture**. Fellows will also aid in establishing the college's new materials library (Mat Lab), which is a key resource within our newly completed <u>Seaton-Regnier Complex</u> building. Additionally, Jarvis Fellows are expected to pursue a Master's Project and Report or Thesis related to materials and performance in landscape architecture.

#### Qualifications

Applicants must a) hold a Bachelor's Degree in architecture, landscape architecture, or closely allied field; b) hold a Master's Degree in architecture or closely allied field; or c) hold a Bachelor's Degree in a non-design field and have a keen desire to focus their graduate research on material technologies and performance in landscape architecture.

Those with demonstrated experience or capacity for design communication, including knowledge of graphic design and website/blog design; strong writing skills; post occupancy analysis; case study preparation; and, experience with the Adobe Creative Suite are most desirable. Successful candidates will also possess capacity to work independently and collaboratively and must demonstrate the potential for exemplary graduate-level scholarship. Collegial collaboration with faculty and other graduate students, and a commitment to engaged learning in the core curricula are a must.

# Eligibility

The fellowship award is contingent on students' acceptance into K-State's MLA program. For priority consideration, students should apply to the MLA program by Feb. 1, 2019. The University deadline for international students to apply is January 8, 2019.
