A signature experience of the MRCP program is completion of an independent capstone experience in the form of a Masters Report or a Thesis. This project, supervised by a committee of Graduate Faculty, allows students to focus on a specific area of professional interest and, in the development of that project, demonstrate the highest level of professional competence they have achieved during their professional education. In Spring 2023, 4 MRCP students completed a project and report or thesis.

The 2023 class cumulative graduate GPA is 3.78 mean, 3.73 median. Assessments were made on the following scale:

- 4.0 Exemplary: Exceeded expectations (Comparable to A work)
- 3.0 Proficient: Met expectations. Mid-range performance (Comparable to B work)
- 2.0 Acceptable: Low-end performance (Comparable to C work)
- 1.0 Deficient/Unsatisfactory: Did not meet expectation. Failing performance (Comparable to D or F work)
