Student Achievement as Determined by the Program

Two aspects of the MRCP curriculum central to students' preparation for their future employment as professional planners is their performance in the Career Preparation class and completion of a capstone experience. Assessment of students in 2015-2016 in these efforts is as follows:

Career Development

MRCP students complete a Career Preparation class that provides an opportunity to develop a professional portfolio based upon their academic work. The portfolio is evaluated on the quality of content and the clarity of graphic quality. Participants in the Fall 2015 class received the following assessments:

Capstone Experience

All MRCP students complete an independent capstone experience in the form of a Master's Project and Report or a Thesis. Each completes a proposal prior to beginning their project or thesis.

In Fall 2015, eleven MRCP students completed project and report proposals. Assessment of their performance in specific areas was:

In all evaluations, the following assessment scale is used:

- 90-100% Demonstrates knowledge and skills exceeding expectations of specific objectives
- 80-89% Demonstrates knowledge and skills meeting expectations of specific objectives
- 70-79% Demonstrates knowledge and skills meeting some but not all expectations of specific objectives
- <69% Does not demonstrate knowledge and skills meeting expectations of specific objectives



The same eleven students worked toward completion of a Master’s Project and Report in May 2016. Ten students completed their project and report. Evaluation of the ten was completed by vote of a supervisory committee of three graduate faculty members. All students received an affirmative vote from each of their committee members. Tuition and Fees

Tuition and fees are calculated for one full academic year (Fall and Spring semesters), and include tuition rates and university and college fees:

Resident: \$12,238

Non-Resident: \$26,323.50

Student Retention and Graduation Rates

The retention rate for a master’s program is the percentage of first year students who return the next academic year. The graduation rate for a master’s program is the percentage of students who graduate within 4 years of graduate school admission.

AICP Exam Pass Rate

To become a certified planner, members of the American Planning Association (APA) must meet certain education and experience requirements and pass the American Institute of Certified Planners (AICP) Exam. The pass rate is the percentage of test takers who pass the examination within 3 years of graduating from a master’s program.

Employment Rate

The Employment Rate measures the percentage of MRCP graduates who obtain planning positions or elect to pursue an advanced degree within one year of graduation.

100% of 2015 graduates were employed in a full-time planning or planning-related position within one year of graduation. Planning or planning-related jobs include: long range planner, planning assistant, and planning technician.
