Teaching / Guided Student Scholarship

Learning is a process of exploration and discovery that should be an exchange of information rooted in sound epistemologies and bound by context. Throughout my career, I have taught a range of courses and content areas in the fields of design education and environmental gerontology directing my approach to advancing the understanding and application of human-centered and evidence-based design philosophies.

I believe we must emphasize the role of design in creating places and practices that empower people to live to their fullest potential at all stages of life across more disciplinary areas of study. More students (and faculty) need to experience "design-thinking" as a way to facilitate interdisciplinary discovery. Part of this paradigm shift must happen in how we educate the next generation of professionals to work collaboratively with diverse stakeholders in solving complex problems. We should be teaching problem-solving with a collection of disciplines in the same space, each discipline bringing its body of knowledge and professional lens to the discussion and the solution.

Research / Scholarship

My research activities are focused on contributing to the body of knowledge in the field of environments for aging, specifically planned care settings for older adults and those with neurocognitive differences. I focus on environmental assessments and applied research activities that bridge the science of discovery to the implementation of evidence-based design in practice.

My current work is directed at developing environmental assessment tools for care settings founded on principles of person-centered care practices and specifically target those environmental characteristics that distinguish the values of residential living and holistic health over institutional routines. Previous research has generally not looked at these relationships as a constellation of well-defined, measurable factors. I believe it is time to consider the inter-relationship of the design attributes in our spaces and correlate them to important human-centered outcomes.
