COURSES TAUGHT

Studio 1 | First-year ID students are taught foundational design principles as well as standard drawing and drafting convention.

Studio 2 | First-year ID students' second studio course further developing design principles and understanding interior design in the built context using physical precedents.

Studio 4 | Second-year ID students begin to understand the complexities and requirements of commercial design. Wellness and health are emphasized to demonstrate the relationship between human wellbeing and the physical environment.

Studio 5 | Third-year ID students learn about hospitality and commercial office space by developing projects through to the level of design development. Students further practice specifying contract furniture and manufactured finish systems.

Studio 6 | Third-year ID students are taught the fundamentals of construction documentation, detailing and communication of a design through the construction phase. Drawing conventions and standard documentation practices are emphasized. **Environmental Systems for Interior Design** | Third-year ID students learn the basics of building systems and interdisciplinary coordination to create healthy, functional spaces with working, sustainable and efficient systems.

Lighting for Interiors | Third-year ID students learn fundamentals of lighting design, as well as new technology in lighting and "smart" building. This course challenges the students to use systems thinking to anticipate opportunities and issues in buildings of the future.

Interior Design Internship | Second- and third-year ID students gain academic credit hours for work experience in design firms and associated disciplines. Students are given opportunity for reflection and consideration of what their work experiences offer them and how to apply what they have learned in studio to a work setting.
