### **SCALING UP PASSIVE HOUSE:**

COMBINING LEAN CONSTRUCTION AND INTEGRATED PROJECT DELIVERY TO CREATE THE COST EFFECTIVE HIGH PERFORMANCE URBAN HOUSING

The world's largest passive house project is underway in Kansas City, saving more than 90% in energy usage. Fundrise is changing the way real estate is funded, allowing anyone with \$1000 to invest. Affordable housing is going green, while a new generation of developers is pursuing triple-bottom line results. This lecture will explore the working edge of mission-led real estate development and the expanding opportunities for social impact from the building to the city scale.

Jonathan Arnold, president and CEO of Arnold Development Group, is responsible for strategy, corporate vision and capital structure. He holds a degree in architecture from Cornell University and a masters degree in real estate development from Columbia University. Over the past 15 years, he has successfully helped design and market more than \$6 billion in commercial real estate, including more than 40 continuing care retirement communities, 2,500 apartment units, and more than two dozen large scale mixed-use urban infill developments.
