



ARCH 403 | SCHUMP

The studio project was to design a dwelling within the urban fabric of Manhattan, Kansas for a retired fire captain who recently purchased the lot and the burnt remains of the home. She intended to take advantage of the Federal Housing Authority's (FHA) 203K loan that allows for homes to be rebuilt using existing foundations after a disaster. In this case, a house destroyed by a fire. Under this program at least seventy-five percent of the existing foundations must be utilized.





The project, intentionally modest in

program and size, and with a foundation present, much of the space planning is already set allowing the designer to move directly to sectional and tectonic development and scale of assemblies and details. The studio was asked to carve space though the assemblies of these components. Students were asked how might the manipulation of sheets, bolts, and beams begin to create spaces that reinforce architectural concepts?


