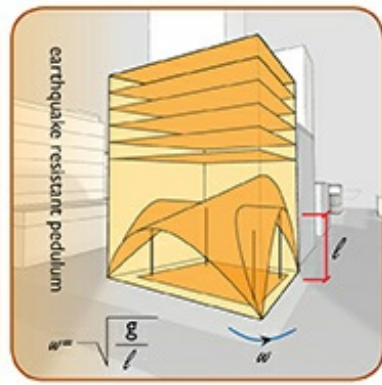
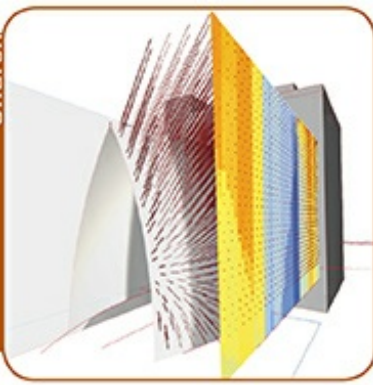


## Howe Studio Update

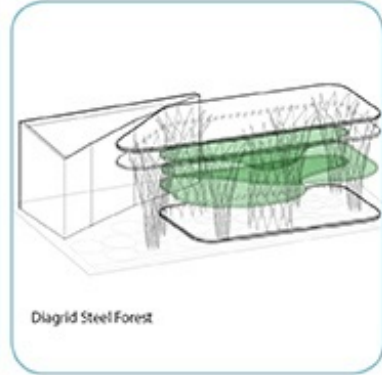
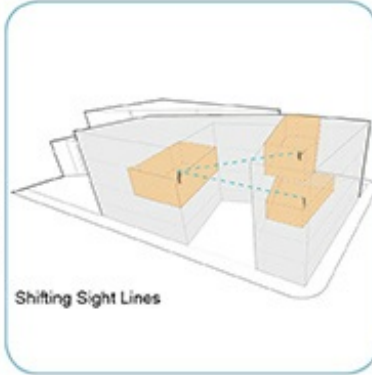
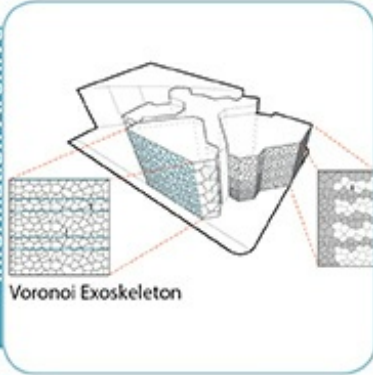
