The Payette Sho-Ping Chin Memorial Academic Scholarship was established specifically for a woman studying architecture within a NAAB accredited bachelor or master's degree program. Sho-Ping, a Fellow and leader in the AIA, was a long-time Principal and health-care practice leader at Payette. She was a talented and compassionate architect who was fiercely determined to design healthcare architecture of the highest caliber for those in need. Sho-Ping was a wonderful mentor and instilled in her teams a sense of camaraderie and commitment to design. As a founder of the AIA Women's Leadership Summit, held biennially, Sho-Ping was instrumental in defining the national discourse for Women in Design.

The \$10,000 scholarship will be awarded to a student who will be entering at least their third year of undergraduate or any level of graduate study within an accredited architecture

program. Previous Payette Sho-Ping Chin Memorial Academic Scholarship recipients are eligible to reapply in subsequent years. To help the scholarship recipient establish contacts within the profession, she will be assigned a senior mentor from Payette for the scholarship year.

Five Master of Architecture students in the department of architecture in the college of APDesign attended the 2015 American Institute of Architecture Students (AIAS) FORUM conference in San Francisco, CA December 29-January 1. The students are active members of the AIAS K-State Chapter and included Alexander Booth (Manhattan, KS), Kathryn Zieno (Bellevue, NE), Morgan Denton (Leawood, KS), Scott Pfeifer (Ellis, KS) and Taylor Hiltgen (Topeka, KS).

The AIAS is an independent, nonprofit, student-run organization dedicated to providing unmatched programs, information, as resources on issues critical to architectural education with almost 6,000 student members from across the globe (AIAS.org). The AIAS FORUM conference is the largest annual gathering of architecture students in the world.

The keynote lectures at the conference were comprised of Rosa Sheng of Bohlin Cysinski Jackson in San Francisco, Carey Smith CEO of Big Ass Fan Solutions, Robert Ivy EVP/Chief Exectuive Officer of the American Institute of Architects, Gervais Thompkin of Gensler in San Francisco, Evelyn Lee of MKThink, Hector M. Perez of Woodbury University's School of Architecture, Irving Gonzales President of AIA San Francisco, and John Cary strategic advisor of the TED Prize. Pfeifer commented on the trip, "Our experience was truly one of a kind. The conference was full of good advice and knowledge regarding architecture in all depths." The students participated in a "firm crawl," visiting four local architecture firms including Heller Manus, Gensler, HOK, and Herman Coliver Locus and spent their leisure time touring the city.
