ITALIAN STUDY ABROAD EXHIBIT ON DISPLAY IN CHANG GALLERY



Exhibits by the College of Architecture, Planning and Design students who participated in the Italian Studies Program at Centro Studi Citta di Orvieto during their spring 2015 semester are on display through Oct. 4 in the Chang Gallery. The exhibit includes photos from their time abroad, final projects they designed, a time lapse video of the Orvieto market, and more. The exhibition is free and open to the public. The gallery is located in the first floor hallway of the east wing at Seaton Hall and is open 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays.

Students in the college's degree-granting programs are given the option to participate in the Italian Studies Program in Orvieto, Italy during their fourth year. In the spring of 2015, 19 APDesign students studied abroad in Orvieto.

According to Professor Lynn Ewanow, Associate Dean and Director of International Programs for the college, this is the ninth group of students who had the opportunity to study in Orvieto.

"The recent recognition of Kansas State University in Italy, located in the Umbrian hilltop of Orvieto, will provide APDesign and other KSU colleges with an extraordinary set of opportunities for students and faculty to engage in international education," said Ewanow.

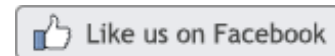

DESIGN CHARRETTE FOR WOUNDED WARRIORS' REHABILITATION AND FARM TRAINING CENTER DESIGN

APDesign Students from all disciplines are invited to participate in a design charrette to develop a master plan for a new farm training and healing center to serve the wounded soldiers and their family. This center is envisioned by SAVE (Soldier Agriculture Vocational Education) organization, and they would like to develop a facility to assist the wounded soldiers returning from Iraq and Afghanistan war. They hope to build this center in Manhattan, Kansas. This farm training and healing center will serve Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI), Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) and severely injured amputees.

[The charrette will be held at APDWest on September 21st evening at 6:30 P.M.](#) Dinner and snacks will be provided for the participants. Students from all disciplines will work collaboratively in teams and present their conceptual design to the client on Sept. 22nd evening at 6:30 p.m.
