

POP-UP URBAN PARK

The Pop-Up Urban Park in Downtown Wichita is officially open!

In fall 2014, the WDDC received a grant from the Knight Foundation Fund at the Wichita Community Foundation to construct a temporary pop-up park. The park site, formerly known as "The Hole," occupies the Douglas Avenue frontage between Market and Main at 121 E. Douglas. The project included filling in "The Hole" with excess fill material (dirt) from the nearby development project on the Arkansas River - River Vista, and the new Child Advocacy Center site. The site was outfitted with colorful furnishings, planters with trees designed by the College of Architecture, Planning & Design at Kansas State University. Nick Mercado, a recent APDesign graduate, created a 16' x 8' art installation titled "Sunflower," displayed. In addition to these, there is also a concrete ping pong table, multiple art pieces, and overhead string lights for ambiance at night to create a unique sense of place for the community.

The park now serves as a community gathering space. There are local food trucks on site for lunch every Monday - Friday, and more events are planned in the coming months.

Project partners include the Knight Foundation, Wichita Community Foundation, Bokeh Development, and the Wichita Downtown Development Corporation.

Project contributors include: Farha Construction, Inc., Together Wichita, Professional Engineering Consultants, City of Wichita Park and Recreation Department, River Vista LLC, Child Advocacy Center of Sedgwick County, Automation Plus, Cox Communications, Cablecom, Inc. and High Touch Technologies.

Third Floor Tidbits

Fees and Fines and Loans, oh my!

A review of K-State Libraries' policies will hopefully help patrons avoid costly oversights with library materials.

Fines

Reserves - 2 hour loan - \$2 per hour, \$200 maximum fine Reserves - 4 hour loan - \$2 per hour, \$54 maximum fine Reserves - 1 to 7 day loan - \$5 per day, \$70 maximum fine 7 day loan - \$1 per day, \$7 maximum All other loans - no fines unless item is lost Recalls placed by library staff - \$5 per day, \$25 maximum

- Weigel Library does not set the fine amounts, but we have to collect them.
- You can pay at Weigel with cash or check; by credit or debit card at Hale Library.
- You can also pay online through your MyLibrary Account.

Loan periods and renewals by patron type

K-State undergraduates - 30 day loan, 11 renewals K-State graduate students and staff - 120 day loan, 2 renewals K-State faculty - 6 month loan, automatically renewed once Kansas residents with Community Patron Card - 30 day loan, 11 renewals

Visiting faculty, researchers and scholars - 30 day loan, 11 renewals

Other material type exceptions

Post-2005 journals - 7 day loan, no renewals DVDs and VHS - 30 day loan, 1 renewal Maps - 30 day loan, 1 renewal

- Weigel staff provides you a date due slip for each material type borrowed as well as verbally communicates the due dates.
- You may renew books at Weigel or online with your MyLibrary Account.

As a library patron you are responsible for the materials you borrow. Please pay attention to loan periods, due dates, return policies, and all notices sent by K-State Libraries.

NOMINATE A GRADUATE FOR THE DISTINGUISHED YOUNG ALUMNI AWARD

Student Alumni Board, a program of the K-State Alumni Association, is seeking nominations for its Distinguished Young Alumni Award. The award, established in 2012, recognizes two Kansas State University graduates who are using the leadership and service experience they acquired at K-State to excel in their professions and contribute to their communities.
