K-State Family hosting Unity Walk and KSUnite By Division of Communications and Marketing All students, faculty and staff are encouraged to join together for the K-State Unity Walk to Anderson Hall lawn from 1-1:30 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 14.

The walk is a symbolic introduction to KSUnite, a communitywide program for diversity, inclusion and equity from 1:30-2:30 p.m. on the Anderson Hall lawn.

The Kansas State University administration has approved a rare closure of all classes and offices from 1-3 p.m. Nov. 14. All members of the community are encouraged to attend.

"This is a great opportunity for the university and the community to come together as we move forward to create a more inclusive and equitable campus," said Jack Ayres, student body president. "All students should plan to join their campus family and be a part of this historic event."

Faculty Senate President Brian Lindshield and University Support Staff Senate President Carrie Fink encourage all faculty, unclassified staff and university support staff to walk and be present at the KSUnite program.

There will be coordinated starting points across campus so people can walk together in unity. K-Staters are encouraged to wear purple and are asked to start walking together at 1 p.m. or when the Anderson Hall bells chime.

Ayres and Darrell Reese, president of the Black Student Union, are hosting the program. The Rev. Troy Bowers will give the invocation and President Richard Myers will provide a message of unity and outline steps that all K-Staters can take as the community moves forward.

Susan Chin
"Future Culture: Connecting Staten Island's Waterfront to its Community"



Susan Chin, FAIA, Hon. ASLA, Executive Director leads the Design Trust for Public Space, a nationally recognized incubator that transforms and evolves the city's landscape with public agencies, community collaborators, and private sector experts-architects, landscape architects, planners, artists, graphic designers, photographers-since 1995. She has overseen key projects, such as Five Borough Farm, Making Midtown, Under the Elevated, The World's Park, Laying the Groundwork, Opening the

Edge and Future Culture. Prior to joining the Design Trust, Ms. Chin served as Assistant Commissioner for Capital Projects at NYC Department of Cultural Affairs for over 20 years, supporting more than \$3 billion in new construction, revitalization and public art projects citywide. Ms. Chin served as Vice President on the American Institute of Architects board, and received numerous awards, including ASLA Honorary Membership in 2015, AIA New York State's 2013 Kideney Gold Medal and 2011 Del Gaudio Award, Loeb Fellowship at Harvard and Distinguished Alumna from Ohio State University.

Charles Mckinney "Buildings as Landscape"



Charles McKinney; Previously, as Chief of Design at New York City Parks, he more than doubled the production of the design program. More innovative park buildings and landscapes, were created under his direction than under any of his predecessors or successors.

As the former Principal Urban Designer for NYC Parks, Charles led the preparation of major park master plans including

Northern Manhattan, VanCortlandt and Riverside Parks. Under his direction, the Department explored responses to the design imperatives of the 21st century; web based planning tools and communication, as well as the role of planning in creating community.

These accomplishments earned him honorary membership from both the American Institute of Architects and the American Society of Landscape Architects. He is Co-Chair of City as Living Laboratory founded by artist Mary Miss, the organization pairs artists and scientists to make environmental issues visceral.



Portfolio Basics - If you need ideas and inspiration before Monday night's event, our books are out for just that.


Peter Wirtz - lecture this week - periodical articles are out and "green" - you can't miss them.
