### **Q&A with IAN SULLIVAN & BETH WITSKEN**

How long have you been part of band/cheer? IAN - I have been part of cheer for seven years in total, three in high school and four at Kansas State. BETH - I have been in band since my freshman ENVD year, but I had to skip my third year because of a class conflict. I am so happy I've been a part of the band as much as I have, it's been amazing!

# How have you balanced academics with this demanding activity?

IAN - When I was in studio I gave 100 percent to working on studio and while I was at cheer practice I focused my energy completely on cheer.

BETH - The KSUMB's Director Dr. Tracz is always saying how determination and hard work are the most important qualities in a band member. I really took that to heart in the very beginning of my freshman year and that has helped drive me through the toughest parts of my college experience. Even if I was tired from a late night in

studio or turning in a project early so I could be at band all Saturday, I stayed focused and determined to succeed because of the lessons I learned in band.

### What is it about band/cheer that you love?

IAN - What I love most about cheer is that it has provided me with so many opportunities and lessons about how to work with others. Being in IAPD it is easy to constantly hang out with the same people because you form strong friendships with the people you are in studio with so going to a practice four times a week with 60 people who come from all different kinds of majors was a great way of branching out and networking. I've also had the opportunity to travel to all the big twelve away stadiums except for West Virginia.

BETH - The band family is so welcoming and fun! I have met some of my best friends through the band and have had endless fun at games or on bowl trips with them. You won't find a more welcoming, kind, hardworking, and goofy group of students anywhere else!

### How has this activity helped you in IAPD and K-State?

IAN - Cheering has helped me in the long run with IAPD because it has given me an outlet to clear my mind. When I feel like I'm stuck on a project I can go to practice and escape thinking about studio for four hours and then when I return I have a clearer mind and can focus on the task at hand. It's also helped me by increasing my time management skills; when you cheer at K-State we have 7:00 AM workouts twice a week, 7:00-9:30 PM practices three times a week, events on Friday before the football game, and must report to football games four hours before kick-off. It's a huge time commitment but the number of friends and memories I've made are worth every second.

BETH - Band has always been a great time to refocus and relax during the hectic school year. Whenever I'm stressed from studio, I can go to practice and just focus on band for a while. It really has helped me keep my brain balanced in times of stress because I have a place to go relax and have fun in a productive way. This has helped me throughout my time in IAPD and in college to focus on the important things, but it has also helped me understand that hard work needs to be balanced by some time for fun.

### Any advice to incoming students looking to get into cheer/band and design school?

IAN - The advice that I have for incoming students that want to be involved in cheer and design school is to do it! My four years completing both has flown by and I would give anything to be a freshman again going from a 9:30 PM practice right back to studio and pulling an all-nighter. The opportunity that I have had to have such supportive coaches, team members, teachers, and colleagues has made my college experience something that only a few people before me have been able to experience.

BETH - Learn to schedule your time well, and make sure to always keep a smile! There will be tough times, but you will get though it and you will be a better person for it. The time flies by and you should cherish every moment you have at this wonderful university and as a part of these organizations!
