Research and/or creative inquiry is broadly defined to include any facultymentored scholarly or creative project or undertaking, whether disciplinary or interdisciplinary, pure or applied, theoretical or practical.

Who is eligible to apply?

Eligibility is extended to all Kansas State University undergraduate students in good academic standing. Awardees may apply for additional funding and may use funding to amplify awards from other sources. First-time and previously unfunded applicants, however, are given priority consideration. Manhattan, Salina, and K-State's Global Campus students may apply.
