

**Public Information related to the Master of Landscape Architecture as required by the Landscape Architecture Accreditation Board**

**Tuition and Fees:**

Estimated living expenses (includes room, board, medical insurance, food, etc): \$12,036 for the fall and spring semesters; \$4,178 for the summer term

Estimated costs of books, supplies, and field trips: \$1,800 for an academic year. Additionally, there is a one-time [required computer purchase](#).

**Student Retention and Graduation Rates:**

The retention rate for a master's program is the percentage of first year students who return the next academic year. The graduation rate for a master's program is the percentage of students who graduate within 4 years of enrolling.

**Scholarships Awarded:**

39 scholarships have been awarded to Landscape Architecture students for the 2020-2021 academic year for a total of \$59,030.

**Employment Rate:**

The employment rate measures the percentage of MLA graduates who obtain landscape architecture positions or elect to pursue an advanced degree within one year of graduation.

100% of 2021 graduates were employed in a full-time landscape architecture position within one year of graduation.
