

Public Information related to the Master of Landscape Architecture as required by the Landscape Architecture Accreditation Board**Tuition and Fees:**

Estimated living expenses (includes room, board, medical insurance, food, etc.): \$14,518 for the fall and spring semesters combined; \$5,436 for the summer term.

Estimated costs of books, supplies, and field trips: \$2,000 for an academic year. Additionally, there is a one-time [required computer purchase](#).

Student Retention and Graduation Rates:

The retention rate for a master's program is the percentage of first year students who return the next academic year. The graduation rate for a master's program is the percentage of students who graduate within 4 years of enrolling.

Scholarships Awarded:

56 scholarships have been awarded to Landscape Architecture students (some receiving more than one award) for the 2024-2025 academic year for a total of \$159,632.

Employment Rate:

The employment rate measures the percentage of MLA graduates who obtain landscape architecture positions or elect to pursue an advanced degree within one year of graduation.

100% of 2024 graduates were employed in a full-time landscape architecture position within one year of graduation.
