Our students' design and planning studies are enriched by frequent interaction with the world outside Seaton/Regnier Hall. Many participate in an education abroad experience and complete an internship. Other students choose to study urban issues at the Kansas City Design Center. All Interior Architecture students, after finishing their third-year, are required to choose two of the following (one must be semester-long experience in the spring of 4th year):

- •APDesign Italian Studies Program or Education Abroad,
- Internship
- •Kansas City Design Center (KCDC)

Education Abroad



Why Education Abroad?

- Academic challenge—experience a range of topics, assignment types, and instruction styles as you engage in various coursework.
- Professional growth—visit notable locations, experience historic and modern design/planning precedents. An education abroad experience can be a desirable credential to future employers.
- Personal enrichment—develop independence, a greater sense of self, and increased awareness and appreciation for other cultures.
- Global perspective—broaden awareness and multicultural competency by living in another country.
- Have a once-in-a-lifetime experience as a University student.

Potential Challenges When Studying Abroad

- The language of instruction may not be English, but full proficiency of the local language is not necessary.
- The academic calendar, including exact semester start and end dates, may differ from K-State.
- Minimal interaction with professors outside of class. University culture may be hierarchical and more formal than at K-State.
- Feelings of homesickness and culture shock are common. The APDesign Student & Academic Services Office and Education Abroad Office have resources to help support you while abroad.

Note: K-State and APDesign have excellent relationships with our partner institutions, but we do not influence their policies or procedures. If you elect to study at a foreign university, you must be prepared to accept and manage potential challenges. K-State Education Abroad can help support you.

Spring program option for <u>IARC</u> Students

- Min. GPA 2.50*
- Enrollment Capacity:
 - Spring: Approx. 40 students across all eligible disciplines
 - Fall: Approx. 30 students across all eligible disciplines
- Language of instruction is English
- Studio and seminar classes taught by K-State and Italian professors
- Studio and seminar typically meet two days per week
- Projects focus on issues/concerns pertaining to the local community
- Program includes multiple field trips and cultural workshops
- Students live in furnished apartments shared with fellow KSU students
- Need to be motivated and flexible

*If the program is at capacity, minimum GPA may be raised.



Orvieto, Italy









- Orvieto is located about one hour north of Rome in the Umbria region of Italy.
- It has a rich history, from its Etruscan underground caves to its Romanesque cathedrals.
- It offers important archaeological, architectural, and urban sites to visit and appreciate.
- The city is considered a living classroom where students are immersed in a culturally stimulating environment surrounded by piazzas, palaces, churches, and cobbled lanes.
- Orvieto has a friendly, calm, and welcoming atmosphere.

- Students live in fully furnished apartments located in the historic part of the city.
- Apartments are arranged by an Italian agency and accommodate two to six students.
- Students shop for their own groceries and cook their own meals. An introduction to the local market and a cooking class with a local chef are part of the first week's orientation.



- Program is 4-weeks dates vary each year
- Language of Instruction in English by K-State APDesign Professors
- Course offerings change each summer
 - Students take two 3-credit elective courses*
 - Studio courses are not offered in this program
- Includes organized travel experiences to Rome and Florence
- Need to be motivated and flexible

Spring program option for IARC Students

Note: this program runs early March to mid-July

- Min. GPA 3.00
- Enrollment Capacity: max. of 3 IARC students
- Language of Instruction in German
- Students take an interior design studio
 - Studio meets one day per week
 - Includes a planned field trip to Milan
- There is an international student center and a helpful German class
- Student housing is not close to the school
- Need to have confidence and some German language proficiency

Spring program option for IARC Students

Note: this program runs early Feb. to June

- Min. GPA 3.00
- Enrollment Capacity: max. of 6 students for all disciplines
- Studio meets one day per week
 - Professor's command of English will vary among the faculty
 - 2-4 weeks given to decide which studio to enroll in
 - Projects range from very conceptual to very realistic (for example, may include structural calculations)
 - Some lectures will include opportunities to learn more about Prague
- Very good support for international students through the International Student Club, which also provides travel opportunities
- Housing is provided in international residence hall, which is close to the architecture building
- Need to self-disciplined and independent

- Studio professors are distinguished practicing Danish designers
- Studio meets three days a week
- Field trips are related to studio and well planned
- Offers highly organized orientation
- Very good support for international students
- Good assistance with housing
- Need to be inquisitive, motivated, and hard-working

Spring program option for IARC Students

Note: this program runs mid-March to early July

- Min. GPA 3.00
- Enrollment Capacity: TBD
- Language of Instruction is German
- Studio meets one day per week
 - Courses are more flexible and less organized than you might typically be used to
 - Professors are relaxed and helpful, but their ability to communicate in English varies
- Travel opportunities provided by the school
- International student housing is recommended, but students must be proactive in making arrangements
- Need to be flexible and self-directed and have language proficiency



Alternative Education Abroad Programs

(Available by petition only)

- This option <u>requires extensive advance preparation</u> and submission of a petition (including short essay responses) for endorsement by your department. Departmentally endorsed petitions must be submitted to the APD International Studies Committee (ISC), and the K-State Education Abroad office **before**October 15, 2025, for final endorsement.
- · Research potential programs you are interested in.
- **Before August 1**, talk with APD K-State Education Abroad Advisor, Amanda Mack, regarding program availability, curriculum questions, scholarships, etc. Email her to schedule an appointment, mackah@ksu.edu.







requirements:

- Must work under a licensed (architect/ ARE) or certified (interiors/ NCIDQ) professional
- 2. MUST be paid
- 3. Duration:
 - 1. Spring: 15 weeks full time (IARC) *Dec 01
 - 2. Summer: 10 weeks** full time *May 01
 - 3. Fall: 15 weeks full time (INDD) *Aug 01
 - **some overseas schedules may impact your ability to complete 10 full weeks.

survey results selected questions

What did you learn from the tasks/projects?

The question was asked to identify where students felt their largest area of growth was. This could be compared to their thoughts on how their academic program prepared them.

technical skills

- Topics included improved CAD skills and learning new software.
- To be expected when adhering to professional standards and application.

professional skills

Topics included **Communication** and **Collaboration**.

- Two of top three topics
- Poses the question, "Where do we learn to collaborate and communicate professionally?"

productivity

Topics include time management and efficiency.

Students seemed to learn to value their time, the time allotted for tasks, and the pace of the industry.

project delivery

Topic included project documentation, specifications, construction administration, and client management.

To be expected as many of these topics are still conceptual for students at this point in their journey.

design

Topics included **process**, **finish selection**, **prototyping**, and **fabrication**.

To be expected as students are exposed to more realistic constraints of design.

survey results selected questions

What were the main difficulties that you have encountered during the internship and how you overcome?

The question was asked to identify where students experienced challenges and what strategies they employed to overcome them.

challenges

- skill development (software + professional literacy)
- career readiness (job acquisition + self-advocacy)
- workplace dynamics
 (communication, collaboration, lifestyle)
- confidence (self-efficacy + selfworth)
- productivity (time-management + efficiency)
- social barriers (socializing + bias/ insensitivity)

resilience strategies

- ownership of development (personal + professional)
- iterative process of learning (practice + active learning)
- adaptability (acclimation + perspective shift)

- use of support systems (mentors + networking)
- emotional + cognitive regulation (self-care, acceptance, vulnerability)
- no strategy identified

selected questions

What could your program have done better to assist you prior to your internship to help you overcome the challenges?

The question was asked to identify where students felt improvement could be made.

preparedness + confidence

Students felt prepared and confident in their ability to be successful in the industry.

technical knowledge + skills Topics included software, materials. building science, and project delivery.

career development

Topics include job acquisition and networking


professional communication

Topics included communication and collaboration.

personal agency

Topics included **self** advocacy, lifestyle adjustments, and academic choice.

Preferencing & Endorsement Process

For the Italian Studies Program and Other Education Abroad Programs

- Programs have limited capacities. You will be required to select a viable second choice on your Off-Campus Study Application.
- The International Studies Committee (ISC) reviews applications and makes endorsements following the Oct. 15 application deadline.

For KCDC

- The program has a limited capacity. You will be required to select a viable second choice on your Off-Campus Study Application.
- The Interdisciplinary Studies & Service Learning (ISSL) Committee reviews applications and makes endorsements following the Oct. 15 application deadline.

Students will be notified of endorsement by **December 1**. Endorsement letters will be sent via email.

We strongly suggest students wait to make housing/personal arrangements for the 2026-27 academic year until they are officially endorsed for a program.
