Why Education Abroad?

- Academic challenge—experience a range of topics, assignment types, and instruction styles as you engage in various coursework
- Professional growth—visit notable locations and experience historic and modern design and planning precedents. An education abroad experience can be a desirable credential to future employers
- Personal enrichment—develop independence, a greater sense of self, and increased awareness and appreciation for other cultures
- Global perspective—broaden awareness and multicultural competency by living in another country
- Have a once in a lifetime experience as a University student

Potential Challenges When Studying Abroad

- Language of instruction may not be English, but full proficiency of the local language is not necessary
- The academic calendar, including exact semester start and end dates, may not be published very far in advance
- Minimal interaction with professors outside of class. University culture may be hierarchical and more formal than at K-State.
- Homesickness and culture shock

Note: K-State and APDesign have excellent relationships with our partner institutions, but we do not influence their policies or procedures. If you elect to study at a foreign university, you must be prepared to accept and manage potential challenges.

Spring program option for RCP + RECD students

- Min. GPA 2.50\*
- Enrollment Capacity:
  - Approx. 55 student for Spring for all disciplines
  - Approx. 15 students for Fall for all disciplines
- Language of instruction is English
- Studio and classes taught by K-State and Italian professors
- Studio and seminar typically meet two days a week
- Projects focus on issues/concerns pertaining to the local community
- Field trips are related to studio and history course
- Shared apartments in Orvieto with fellow APD students
- Need to be motivated and flexible

# Summer program option for all K-State Students

- Min. GPA 2.5
- Open to all K-State Students
- Program is 4-weeks, dates vary
- Language of Instruction in English by K-State Professors
- \*Studio courses are <u>NOT</u> offered in this program
- Course offerings change each summer
- Organized travel opportunities to Rome and Florence
- Need to be motivated and flexible

(Available by petition only)

Research potential programs

- This option requires extensive advance preparation and submission of a petition (including short essay responses) for endorsement by your Department, the APD International Studies Committee (ISC), and K-State Office of International Programs (OIP)
- Endorsement does NOT guarantee admission by the partner institution – application to partner institution is a separate process





All NB RCP and RECD students have the option to complete an internship. This will either be during 6<sup>th</sup> semester <u>OR</u>, if you study abroad or do KCDC that semester, your internship should occur during the summer.

Internships vary with a wide range of professional options. All must be approved <u>prior to</u> starting in order to receive credit.

## KANSAS STATE College of Architecture, Planning & Design UNIVERSITY Department of Landscape Architecture and Regional & Community Planning

### Internship Agreement between Internship Sponsor, Department, and Student Intern

<u>Purpose</u>: The purpose of the LARCP internship program is to offer its students the opportunity to broaden their educational experiences by actively participating in a professional work environment. The internship is an opportunity to apply the knowledge and skills gained in the university to a professional setting while also identifying the aspects of one's education that warrant further exploration in the final year of study.

<u>Academic Expectations</u>: The Landscape Architecture program at Kansas State University requires students to seek and participate in a professional internship for academic credit. The experience may be:

- 8 to 10-week summer internship
- a semester-long 16-week internship
- an extended spring and summer internship of up to 28 weeks

The Regional & Community Planning program requires students to seek and participate in a semesterlong off-campus experience for academic credit. The experience may be an internship or a study abroad experience.

#### **Responsibilities:**

Internship Sponsor: Internship Sponsors (employers) will provide full time employment compensated at a fair and appropriate wage. The Sponsor will be diligent in assigning work responsibilities to the Intern that will broaden his/her knowledge base, challenge his/her capabilities and permit him/her to participate fully as a contributing member of a project team. It is expected that the Student Intern will participate in planning, programming, and/or design discussions and decisions, attend presentations, meet clients/stakeholders, and be given every opportunity to contribute to the success of a project in accordance with his/her capabilities. It is of particular interest that the Intern understands the organization of the office, how project decisions are made, management/administration processes, and office research methods.

The Internship Sponsor is responsible for providing the Intern direction and work reviews on a regular basis by an assigned office mentor. Employers will provide oversight by a licensed, certified, or qualified individual in their profession. Upon completion of the internship, the Sponsor will be asked to write a brief summation of the intern's strengths and weaknesses. The information provided will be shared only with faculty and used to direct our educational efforts to improve our instruction.

The Intern has course responsibilities and assignments which will be submitted for faculty review during the internship and upon his/her return to the university. The work will be evaluated by the LARCP office and made available to the faculty. Grades will be given for the work products required of the student intern and will not reflect office performance.

<u>Student Intern</u>: Students are required to secure an internship meeting their academic and professional goals. Students must submit the internship request first to the Department Head and then upload this agreement form with sponsor and student signatures to Canvas site provided by the LARCP office prior to beginning employment.

The Intern is responsible for participating and executing, to the best of his/her abilities, work assigned by the Internship Sponsor. Interns will prepare the following academic products:

- Bi-monthly reports summarizing experience, reviewed by the Internship Supervisor
- Reflection paper at the end of the internship
- Poster presentation as specified by the LARCP office
- Oral and visual presentation as specified by the LARCP office
